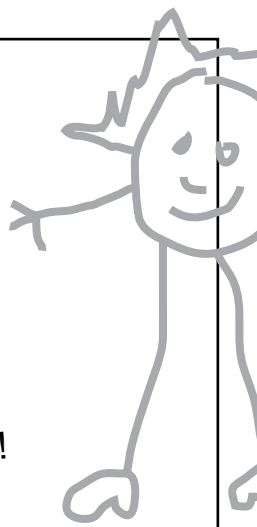


# Chalk Drawings

You can get big pieces of chalk very cheaply these days at two dollar shops or similar. Let your children's imaginations go wild and give them free rein to create a beautiful artwork in your driveway or on the pavement outside! If you're not happy with what you see, rest assured that the chalk will be washed away next time it rains (or you can hose it down in the meantime).

If outside artwork isn't your thing, try working with large sheets of black paper (for amazing results), or recycled cardboard or cartridge paper. For a more unusual effect, try **wetting** the chalk before you begin (soak the chalk sticks in water for about ten minutes).

Or, how about a chalk map? One person creates a trail for the others to follow leaving chalk marks (such as arrows on the pavement or on trees) to show direction. The map could lead to buried treasure, or the person who created the trail could be hiding at the end of it.
